People who lack basic literacy skills cannot fill out a job application, open a bank account, or read to their children. The **National Assessment of Adult Literacy** reports that 90,000,000 adults lack the literacy skills needed to succeed as a parent, in the workplace, or in the community.

In **Central Florida**, 1 in 5 adults have only the most basic literacy skills.

In 2009, the U.S. House of Representatives declared:

- The economy and the world marketplace depend on having a **literate, skilled population**.
- Parental involvement increases as the education level of the parent increases.
- People who lack literacy skills are unable to keep a job with family-sustaining income.
- Prisoners without literacy skills are more likely to re-offend.

Adult Literacy

Our tutors and instructors work to help their students learn basic skills such as the **alphabet**, **phonics**, and **writing** as they become emerging readers.

Adult Basic Education

Students begin to build on their skills to increase reading **fluency**, **comprehension**, **grammar**, and **vocabulary** so that they move from learning to read to reading to learn.

English Language Literacy (ESOL)

Students who speak in other languages work in **small classes** or with **tutors** to improve English reading and conversation skills to communicate successfully in English.
